Montessori Tidbit

Speak Like a Montessorian

One difference often found between Montessori teachers and other educators is the way they speak. You might regularly hear teachers, coaches, or even yourself, saying, "Good job!" Many people consider this to be positive reinforcement without recognizing the judgment included as well as the effect it may have on our children. Montessorians identify and validate the effort children make, focusing on process rather than product. One might hear, "You concentrated for thirty minutes on your addition problems," rather than, "Good job, you got them all right!" Without realizing it, many adults promote children being "praise junkies", and they become completely dependent on our evaluation of their work or behavior. This keeps the child looking to us for more approval rather than forming their own, independent judgments. We do not want our children to grow into adults who continue to need others to tell them how well they did.

The specific, thoughtful way in which we encourage and support our children is what makes all the difference. Praise generally motivates children to get more praise. Genuine, specific comments about the effort or attitude your child exhibited, or commentary on how their work helped the class or family are

less likely to create children who crave praise and more likely to create children who focus on positive, internal qualities.

Often, Montessori teachers ask children questions about their work rather than commenting on it. When your child asks you, "Is it good?" Or, "Do you like my _____?" Rather than answering the question, ask one of your own. Ask what she likes about the work, what her favorite part is, or the way she accomplished the task. This helps your child begin to evaluate her own work and effort without looking for external approval, which aids self-confidence and a sense of capability. In addition, Montessori teachers often make observations, such as,

The next time you are tempted to praise your child, try noticing something specific, or ask a question instead.
