Each winter I like to review the Montessori Principles of Education that Lillard pointed out in her book "The Science Behind the Genius". Whatever the reason, I wanted to review them with you, and each week I will dive into what one of them means to me, how I perceive the principle should work in practice. For those that are new to the Montessori principle this will be new information, for those that are seasoned Montessori parents, it is just a review. - Movement and Cognition are closely enter-twined
- Learning and well-being are improved when people have a sense of control over their environment
- People learn better when they are interested in what they are learning about
- Extrinsic rewards have a negative impact on motivation to engage
- Collaborative arrangements are very conducive to learning
- Learning situated in meaningful context is often deeper and richer
- Particular forms of adult interaction are associated with more optimal child outcomes
- Order in the environment is beneficial to children
