

Reading Tips for Home

Research proves that the single most effective thing a parent can do to insure academic success is to read to kids at home, OFTEN.

This does several things:

Sends the message that reading is important (if parent stops busy schedule to read).

Sends the message that the child is important (see above). Lets the child hear the flow of language (which helps speech,

reading, and writing).

Fosters a love of books by associating reading with quality parent time.
